The Center for Intercultural Psychology and Education (CIPE) was founded in September 2005 as an independent institute of the Faculty of Education and Psychology at ELTE University. The Center is engaged in both education and interdisciplinary research. Its goal is to study multi-and intercultural issues from the perspective of anthropology, psychology, education and the sociology of education, and to promote the integration of research findings into the training and education of students.

The Program, which is one of the few of its kind in Europe, is strongly committed to interdisciplinary studies with a focus on psychological and educational issues. Focusing on the human dimensions of intercultural issues and interactions while giving ample consideration to their global context distinguishes the Program from macro-historical, macro-political or macro-sociological approaches.

Students will be trained to manage inevitable tensions and conflicts to use diversity as an asset to benefit the whole society. They will become aware of their own human rights as well as others'. Graduates with intercultural knowledge and skills will support the integration of minorities – particularly that of Roma, migrants and refugees. They will also help the training and the mobility of people in the international labor market and promote equality of opportunities for members of disadvantaged groups, who suffer from prejudices, and explicit or implicit discrimination. In addition to theoretical knowledge, the Program provides plenty of opportunities for students to do field work, to gain field experience and develop their skills in real-life situations.
