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# INTRODUCTION

### WHAT IS ERASMUS?

- Exchange abroad (1 semester in another Erasmus country)

   Part of the study program
- **Traineeship abroad** (curricular or voluntary traineeship in another Erasmus country) *Traineeship during studies Traineeship after graduation* 
  - Relevant to the study programme
  - Opportunity + grant

# **APPLICATION**

## WHO CAN APPLY?

Special faculty requirements might occur!

### **Students** SH and SCYP!

- who have student status at Eötvös Loránd University at the time of the application;
- with Hungarian nationality or registration of permanent residence permit or residence permit
- in case of studying in a bachelor (BA) or undivided one-tier studies: already have at least 1 closed semester;
- with active student status at Eötvös Loránd University in the semester of the planned mobility (except of internship of post graduate students);
- who meet the criteria of the department's or institute's published call
- *SH and* SCYP: If you apply to Erasmus studies and win it, you will lose your entitlement to participate in the SH/SCYP programme.

## **STUDIES IN SWITZERLAND**

### "Swiss-European Mobility Programme" (SEMP)

- Applications to ELTE SEMP partners: via **Neptun**
- Grant: from the host institution, approx. 2300 CHF per semester (~ approx. 2430 EUR).

You cannot apply for Erasmus+ additional support with SEMP mobility!

- **Documentation:** according to the regulations of the host university
- The credit recognition process is identical to the Erasmus+ mobility.

# **PLANNING: ERASMUS STUDIES**

• Where can I go?

Faculty lists are in the call, the universities listed in the Neptun (Erasmus menu),

For information on the availability of partner universities, please follow the central call.

- You can give 3 universities by order of preference
- 20 ECTS must be fulfilled per semester (BA, MA and undivided one-tier studies)
   PhD: There is no minimum credit expectation in the case of research activity at the partner university.
- Conscious choice of Host Institution
- Compare the ELTE course catalog (curriculum) to the the partner university course catalog (curriculum) (study cycle/level, language, courses)
- **Recognition of credits/courses:** as an elective or compulsory (elective) subject
- Consultation with the course instructors, academic international coordinators about the courses!
- Erasmus/individual course schedule (can vary by faculties)\*
- **Germany** (due to longer semesters it is not recommended in the last semester)

# PLANNING: ERASMUS TRAINEESHIP

#### • Where can I go?

Students independently seek a placement (no partner list)

To any organization or institution located in an Erasmus + program country except EU bodies

Conscious choice of Host Institution

- Write to companies/institutions where you would want to work and explain that you would go with the Erasmus+ programme. Try to ask a Letter of Acceptance that you can attach to your Erasmus application. Minimum 30 hours/week
- **Consultation with the course instructors, academic international coordinators** about the traineeship programme.
- Recognition of the traineeship: For credits or in the diploma supplement
- SH and SCYP students: traineeship during summer DATES! \*
- Traineeship after graduation has to end in 1 year after graduation.

#### **GRANT/SCHOLARSHIP:**

- Payment schedule: **90% 10%**
- Currency: EUR > Euro bank account is suggested
- The grant/scholarship **does not** cover all the costs that arise during their stay abroad
- Traineeships: allowances are allowed

# **EVALUATION, NOMINATION**

#### VIII. EVALUATION OF THE APPLICATIONS

Submitted applications are evaluated by a professional board, stood up by the Institute/Department. The evaluation criteria are published in the call.

The student might be required to participate at a personal interview after receiving the written evaluation.

General criteria of the evaluation (the list is not in a priority order, there might be other aspects as well according to differing Faculty regulations):

- · Language proficiency at the study field,
- Academic achievement,
- · Professional awareness,
- · Academic excellence or other significant professional achievement,
- · Participation in Student Union activities or others at related organizations,
- Participation in a Student Mentor/Buddy System, supporting students.

Those students who have never participated in the Erasmus+ Programme have priority during the evaluation process, however, we strongly encourage the re-application of former Erasmus + students too.

Based on the above points, the Institutes/Departments nominate students to the Erasmus Board (for study tours, internships and financial grants).

Attention! If you have simultaneously submitted other applications in the framework of the following calls: Erasmus+ study abroad program within the framework of agreements for all subject fields or outside Europe, and one of them will be awarded, your mobility application for the same mobility period will be considered cancelled.

Those students, who were nominated by the host university but were not granted financial support by the Erasmus Board, might also travel to participate in the Erasmus programme, but they need to fully cover their costs. These students are named "zero grant students". Thanks to this status, students are free from any payment at the host university, i.e. zero grant students do not need to pay tuition fee and any costs of registration, exams, laboratory and library.

The full list of the accepted students will be approved by the Students and Staff Mobility Committee expectedly in the first half of April 2024. Supported students will be informed via Neptun message and via their e-mail found in Neptun no later than 1 week after the Committee's decision. (To see the result you have to login to Neptun.)

All the applications for internships submitted later will be approved by Students and Staff Mobility Committee within two months of submission (the evaluation time might be extended during the summer and winter holidays), thus it is still possible to apply for Erasmus+ traineeships after 26 February 2024. Supported students will be informed by e-mail no later than 1 week after the Committee's decision.

## NOMINATION

- The evaluation is a multi-stage process. First, the application is evaluated by the faculty professional board. The
  faculty/academic coordinator might pre-inform about the result, yet only the result announcement sent after Students
  and Staff Mobility Committee meeting is considered to be the final decision.
- Applications until 26 February (studies and traineeships): The final decision arrives to the e-mail address given in the Neptun system. The result can be seen under the Erasmus menu item as well. Decision expected in the first half of April.
- Applications after 26 February 2024 (traineeships): Decisions within two months of submission (via email).
- Supported students (for studies) will be nominated to the partner university.

#### Conditional Nomination:

Nomination sent by the international coordinator to the receiving university before the final decision about the application. It happens **if the nomination deadline is earlier than the ELTE Students and Staff Mobility Committee meeting.** It is conditional, because it is earlier than the official decision.

#### NOMINATION

The supported students will be nominated by Institutes/Departments at the partner institution. We would like to call the students' attention that the nomination process and deadlines are varying in every host institution/university, thus we suggest to obtain informations about the nomination deadlines of the host institution and make sure that you are nominated at the right partner institution.

The partner institution always confirm whether or not can receive you for the semester and the programme that you have applied for.

- Primarily to those students for whom there are only a few Erasmus host institutions available, and secondly to those who are specifically interested in a CHARM-EU or Coimbra Group partner institution available for studies. There are many high-level partner institutions!
- Application submission: until 26th of February (on the online form available in the call for applications)\*

### **Grant amount**


- 5 14 days 79 euros/day
- 15 30 days 56 euros/day

+ An additional 1-1 travel days may be granted before and after the mobility.\*

- Eligible activities: studies, traineeship, short-term doctoral mobility


