

## Trip Report

I am Lkhagvsuren Enkhsaruul, a third-year PhD student at the Department of Mongolian and Inner Asian Studies, ELTE, awarded a travel grant from the Talent Support Council to participate in an international academic conference held in Brno, the Czech Republic, between April 4-5, 2024.
