Budapest Highlights

Must-See Sights for Summer University Students

Welcome to Budapest, one of Europe's most beautiful and exciting capital cities! Divided by the Danube river into the historic Buda and the vibrant Pest, Budapest is a perfect blend of culture, architecture, nature, and nightlife. Whether you're staying for a few weeks or just a few days here are the city's top sights you won't want to miss!

BUDA CASTLE CASTLE DISTRICT

WHAT is it?

A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Buda Castle sits atop Castle Hill and offers stunning views over the Danube and Pest. The castle complex includes the Hungarian National Gallery, the Budapest History Museum, and the Széchenyi National Library.

WHY visit?

Wander the cobblestone streets, explore the medieval ruins, and enjoy panoramic views. It's especially magical at sunset or in the evening when the whole district lights up.

TIP:

entry to the courtyards is free, the museums require tickets.

Fisherman's Bastion (Halászbástya)

WHAT is it?

A fairytale-like terrace with white turrets and arcades that overlooks the Parliament and the Danube.

WHY visit?

It's one of the best photo spots in the city, and the nearby Matthias Church with its colorful tlled roof is a true architectural gem.

IP:

free sections available, upper balconies have a small fee.

WHAT is it?

The iconic Hungarian Parliament building is one of Europe's largest and most beautiful legislative buildings, located on the Pest side of the city.

THE PARLIAMENT

WHY visit?

Its neo-gothic facade and riverside location make it a city symbol. Guided tours will let you see the holy crown of Hungary and the ornate interior.

TIP:

Book tickets in advance for inside tours, EU citizens get discounts.

Heroe's square and City Park (Városliget)



WHAT is it?

Heroes' Square features the Millenium Monument and statues of Hungary's founding leaders. It's the gateway to City Park, a huge green area perfect for walks or a picnic.

WHAT ELSE is nearby?

Vajdahunyad Castle - A charming, eclectic castle within the park Széchenyi Baths - one of Europe's largest thermal spa complexes Budapest zoo and Museum of Fine Arts - perfect for relaxed afternoons

The Jewish Quarter and Dohány Street Synagogue



WHAT is it

Budapest's Jewish Quarter is both a historical and cultural center. The Dohánz Street Synagogue is Europe's largest, with a rich museum and moving Holocaust memorials.

Also EXPLORE:

The "Ruin Bars", especially Szimpla Kert - iconic nightlife in abandoned buildings, street art, cafés and vintage stores



a guided tour is highly recommended to understand the history.

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Margaret Island (Margitsziget)

WHAT is it?

A peaceful green oasis in the middle of the Danube.

WHY visit?

Rent a bike, watch the musical fountain, explore medieval ruins, or just chill on the grass. There's also a running track around the island - perfect for runners.

TIP: free concerts and oudoor events happen here in summer.

Budapest has a growing variety of **grocery stores and restaurants** catering to different cultural, religious, and dietary needs. Whether you're looking for **halal**, **kosher**, **vegetarian**, **vegan**, **gluten-free**, **or Asian** options, here's a guide to help you find what you need.

Tips for Special Diets in Budapest

What is BKK?

BKK

BKK is Budapest's public transport system, covering:

- 🗹 Metro (4 lines)
- **Trams** (including the famous tram 2 by the river)
- 🗸 Buses
- 🔽 Trolleybuses

Suburban trains (HÉV) within the city

Public transport is reliable, cheap, and the best way to get around!

Tickets & Passes

You must always have a valid ticket or pass before boarding.

- Single Ticket: Valid for one journey (no transfer).
- Transfer Ticket: For journeys with one connection.
- 24-hour Pass: Unlimited travel for one day.
- 72-hour Pass: Great for visitors staying a few days.
- Monthly Student Pass: Available for students with a valid Hungarian student ID (including ELTE Summer University students).

Tickets are not sold on board – buy them in advance at:

- BKK vending machines (at metro stations and stops)
- BKK customer centers
- Using the BudapestGO app

What is BudapestGO?

BudapestGO is BKK's official app for planning your journeys and buying tickets. Available for **Android** and **iOS**.

- 🗸 Real-time route planner
- 🗹 Buy and store digital tickets/passes
- 🗹 Check tram, bus, metro timetables
- 🌌 See alerts (delays, closures)

How to use it:

- 1. Download from Google Play or App Store.
- 2. Register with your email.
- 3. Add a payment method.
- 4. Buy a ticket or pass \rightarrow it appears in the app \rightarrow activate it before travel!

Some tickets (like single or 24h) must be activated in the app right before boarding.

Ticket Validation

If using a **paper ticket**, validate it at the orange machines at metro entrances or on buses/trams.

If using a **mobile ticket**,

activate it in BudapestGO → show the QR code if asked by an inspector.

A Fines for traveling without a valid ticket are around 8,000 HUF on the spot.

Extra Tips

- Metro runs **5 AM 11:30 PM**; night buses operate afterward.
- Tram line 6 runs non-stop, 24/7.
- Download Google Maps or use BudapestGO for the fastest route planning.
- Buses numbered 100+ go to/from the airport (esp. bus 100E, a direct airport shuttle).
